

Prevalence of Undernourishment 2020-2022 SDG Indicator 2.1.1




Map 1: Main Coffee Exporting Countries

# The Food Security Standard (FSS)

Developed to help the **private sector** to respond to food insecurity and human rights due diligence obligations.

Aims to foster **zero hunger at the production level** of global agricultural value chains.

Based on the **Human Right to adequate Food**.



# Safeguarding Food Security with the FSS

Right to adequate Food is protected by producers of agricultural commodities within their field of responsibility

- Farmers and workers are food secure
- Food security in area of influence does not deteriorate.

- Full integration of the FSS Criteria in 4C checklist
- Full integration of the FSS procedures and tools in 4C Audit procedures
- To be checked during the same audit
